



Sapper Fred Greenhalgh  
Royal Engineers  
Railway Ordinance Department  
Died 16/7/17 aged 37 Years  
Served France & Flanders

Sapper Fred Greenhalgh, of the Railway Ordinance department of the Royal Engineers, died from pneumonia in hospital at Boulogne, on February 16<sup>th</sup>.

He was the son of Mr Noah Greenhalgh, of 164 Bolton Road, Elton, and was 37 years old. In civil life the deceased was employed in the engineering department at the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company's offices, Hunt's Bank, Manchester. Right from the beginning of the war the deceased had had a desire to serve his country, but it was not until November last that he was able to get release from his railway work. He was married last September, but his wife died suddenly three months later. Sapper Greenhalgh only went to France at the beginning of this month. His name is on the roll of honour of Bank Street Unitarian Sunday School. He was an exceedingly popular member of the Trevelyan Club, the flag upon which has been raised to half-mast as a mark of respect to his memory.
