Pte. John Eatough (27) of the Lancashire Fusiliers (T) was killed in action on 9th September. His wife resides at 28 Parsonage Street. Bury. He joined the Territorials in October 1914, and went with his battalion to France in the following May. Previously he worked at the Pilot Mill. His name is on the Bank Street Chapel roll of honour. His brother, Pte. Leonard Eatough was killed in the Dardanelles in June, 1915.

He was awarded the Military Medal for acts of gallantry and devotion to duty under fire.

His parents were Novello and Clara Eatough, 129 Spring Street.
