Killed in action 29/9/18  
Served in France & Flanders

Mrs Heslop of 6 Denton Street, Bury was last week officially informed that her husband, Sergeant William Dinsdale Heslop, of the King's Liverpool Regiment, was killed in action in France on September 29<sup>th</sup> after four years service, - the last two years in France - has received a letter from the deceased's officer stating that Sergeant Heslop was killed by a machine gun bullet and was buried next day in a cemetery not far from where he fell. The deceased had always proved himself to be a good soldier and N.C.O. and the writer of the letter expressed sympathy with Mrs Heslop on behalf of all ranks. Before enlisting in September 1914 Sergeant Heslop was employed as a pattern card maker for Messrs Steiner, calico printers, Manchester. His name is on the Bank Street Church roll of honour and he was also a member of the church choir, and a member of the Bury stage society. He was the eldest son of Mr and Mrs Heslop of 23 Malvern Avenue, Bury. His brother, John, a sapper is on service in Salonica.
