THE DOG DAYS ARE NOW WITH US

The typical heat and humidity of August remind us that it is the peak of the summer holiday season. What we often don't reflect on is the meaning of the description of this time of year as "the dog days of summer." This term is derived from the ancient habit of watching the constellations for signs. The brightest of the stars seen at this time of the year is *Canis Major* (the big dog), otherwise known as Sirius. From the end of July to the middle of August, this star rises and sets with the sun, and the star-gazers of the past believed that its heat amplified the sun's warmth, thus ushering in a spell of muggy weather. The dog days were thus a reference to the prominence of the dog star, and the accompanying weather.

Our own body-clocks can sense the change in the air, and the need to "cool off" somewhat. We have the opportunity at this time of the year to freshen-up our own lives—with a holiday away from home, through added time spent out of doors (especially in the garden), or

possibly the challenge of a summer project that will give shape and purpose to these days of greater freedom and flexibility. My own plans include visits with friends (mostly clergy of other denominations) in North Wales, where I hope to visit some old Celtic sites. One goal I have set is to walk some of the pilgrim path on the Lleyn Peninsula to Bardsey (the "island of 20,000 saints). Many churches, chapels, wells and monuments are to be found along the path, and each has its story to tell of the different ages of settlement in that region of Wales. It should be an enjoyable journey, with the added attraction of stopping with friends along the way.

I hope that all readers of our church calendar will find some new adventures in the "dog days" of August, and that we will have stories to share once the season of autumn begins. Go well.

Visit to Manjushri Kadampa Buddhist Centre, Conishead Priory, Ulverston

A visit to the Buddhist Centre in Ulverston is planned for the afternoon of Weds 8th September. The visit will be an interesting experience in itself but will also provide us with an opportunity to consider whether it would be a suitable venue for a retreat in the future. The Centre is based in a historic house in a beautiful parkland setting near Ulverston. There is a leaflet on the notice board with pictures of the grounds and buildings.

There will be a guided tour of approx 1 ½ hours which will begin with a DVD about the history of Conishead followed by an opportunity to view the historic features of the mansion. This will be followed by a short walk through the gardens to the Buddhist Temple where the guide will explain its spiritual meaning and how it is

used for prayers and meditation. The visit will conclude with Tea/Coffee and Cake in the refectory.

The tour is planned to start at 2pm and we anticipate leaving at approximately 4pm. The cost will be £3.75 per person to cover the cost of the guided tour and refreshments.

If you are interested in joining this excursion, please sign your name on the list on the lounge notice board. Depending on the numbers who wish to attend, a decision will be taken about whether we travel by coach or by private car. Of course there will be further costs involved if we decide to travel by coach.

The planning of our visit is in its early stages, at present; further details will be available in the September Calendar and regular pulpit-announcements will be made. If you have queries, Jeff or I will do our best to answer. *Val Chamberlain*

RICE MATTERS

Please make a note in your diaries that our Rice Challenge will take place during the Harvest Weekend (October 2nd and 3rd), when we will hope to sell 90 kilograms of Kilombero Rice. Each 1 kilogram bag costs £2.50, which will raise £225---enough to support a young person through high school in Malawi for a year.

Several people have asked whether it will be possible to buy brown rice, rather than white, and Just Trading Scotland have agreed to include brown rice in the delivery; however, this will have to be specifically ordered, so please speak to Anne Mills, if you would prefer brown to white.
