#### Welcoming new members

We hope to hold a membership service on the day of the AGM, but this has yet to be confirmed. I know that we're all delighted to welcome them.

#### **First Aiders**

Anne Evitts and Susan Mitchell have recently been on a one-day First Aid training course: they both have many years of experience in nursing, and we are grateful that they've updated their knowledge and are both willing to act as our named First Aiders in church. They have both also been trained in using the defibrillator.

#### Safeguarding officers

Ewen Sim has recently undertaken courses in safeguarding both children and vulnerable adults. He will join June Clarke as one of our nominated safeguarding officers. He will be working with Kate on updating the church safeguarding policy soon.

#### Worship and spiritual practices:

#### **Sunday Services**

We continue to meet on Sundays at 11.15am to worship together (the service lasts around an hour and is followed by refreshments and conversation).

We hope to resume Sunday Zoom services on the second Sunday and possibly the fourth Sunday of each month: there will be a Zoom on Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> March, and possibly on Sunday 26<sup>th</sup>: watch this space.

#### **Inclusive Communion Services**

We generally hold an inclusive communion service on the first Sunday of each month, at 12.30 (after the main service). There will be a Communion on Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> March: everyone is welcome to this simple and sacred sharing of food, juice, and community.

You're very welcome, even if you've never been before.

From April we will be moving the Communion service to the **last** Sunday of the month: they currently fall on the same day as the service at Ainsworth, and several people like to attend both.

#### Midweek online meditations:

The meditations have resumed, but there won't be one in March as Kate will be on leave on the relevant date. We'll start again in April. In the meantime please ask Kate for details of other online meditations offered by Unitarian groups.

We are still working on dates for these sessions, which Hannah is hoping to run over the next two or three months. We'll keep you updated as plans progress!

#### Spring equinox

Kate will be on leave on the day of the Spring Equinox, but if you'd like to celebrate with other Unitarians, she'll happily try and find out who else is offering something.

#### Worship Group

You may know that we have a Worship Group in the congregation, who work really hard behind the scenes to provide good quality worship when Kate is away. They have a long history of leading nourishing and enjoyable worship, and the care and love they put into services is hugely appreciated.

They are very open to new members. Would you like to be part of planning the occasional service, or providing worship material? You don't need experience, and you can go at whatever pace is comfortable for you.

#### News from the building.

We are all in the process of a very welcome change: as we move from the quieter, darker times of Winter into the bright new light of Spring we have much that we can look forward to. This simple truth of nature means that there is much that cannot be done when it's freezing cold and threatening to rain, but the change is coming, and with that, some work in the building that feels long since due will soon be able to be dealt with.

Change being an ever present reality, means that it's not just the seasons that alter. You might remember that in the calendar last year, I paid thanks to Roger Mills who had then retired as the property trustee, the person with primary responsibility for the safety and security of our beloved building. I'm very pleased to let you know; for those of you who don't; that Howard Maden has recently agreed to take on this responsibility, and I would like to take this time to thank him for doing so. I invite you, the next time you see him, to welcome him too.

#### **Primary Room**

The Church Council has been discussing ways to make the Primary Room into a space which we can use in more and different ways: we think it might be possible to turn it into a room for small groups and confidential chats, or a space to sit and read. Apart from the benefits to our own community, groups booking the upstairs hall might like to have a 'break out' space available.

We are very committed to keeping it available as a welcoming space for the children, and to making sure we can still use it when we're using the upstairs kitchen, and we don't want this to cost much in time or energy.

Do you have any ideas? They don't – initially – have to be practical. Dreams are always good places to start!

#### Church building open (and warm) on Fridays.

As you probably know, the church building is normally open on Fridays between 10-3, to allow Kate to work in the vestry and be available to people who prefer to pop in to church rather than to have her visit at home. Please know that you are very welcome to come into church even if you don't particularly want to see Kate! As the weather remains chilly, and as fuel prices continue to rise, please know that at least on a Friday we would love you (and your friends, and anyone you know who could make use of this) to pop in and keep warm here. If I am ever not going to be able to be here, I will try to arrange for someone else to open up instead.

I will be off work from after the service (and tidying up the Give and Take) on Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> March until the morning of Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> March.

#### From Uni-News, 3 February 2023

We are pleased to announce the election of two new members to our Executive Committee: John Bates and Rev. Wyn Thomas. The Executive Committee act as trustees for the General Assembly (GA) and Nightingale Centre and work with the Chief Officer and other staff and volunteers to develop and oversee the strategic direction and smooth running of the GA. John was nominated by New Unity CIO and Wyn by Cheltenham & Gloucester Unitarians.

As there were four vacancies on the EC and two candidates, both are elected unopposed, and the remaining vacancies may later be filled by co-option.

#### William Allard 1803-1831: Minister at Bury Unitarian Church.

William Allard, born 1767 at Daventry.

He started his ministry at Rotherham. When he left there in 1793 his stipend was £80 per year and he lived in the parsonage. While there, he was instrumental in starting the Hollis School, where there was moral and religious training as well as secular studies. He married Susannah Bingley of Rotherham. Next, he was at Stockport for a few months, then he moved to Derbyshire, where he was minister at Bradwell, Stoney Middleton and Ashford in the Peak District, and Hucklow. In 1796 he was instrumental in the building of the stone chapel at Great Hucklow. Next, in 1798, he went to Coseley. Here he established a Sunday School.

William Allard had five children, the fourth child named Thomas Barnes Allard, born 1799. It is most likely that he was named after Rev Thomas Barnes.

Rev Thomas Barnes had been Minister at Cockey Moore, then Cross Street, Manchester, and became principal of Manchester New College 1784-1798.

Rev William Allard came to Bury in 1804. He lived at 19, Union Square, Bury. B&M store is approximately in the position of Union Square. Back in 1804 Union Square was a prime place to live.

During William Allard's time at Bury the Chapel Library, the Sunday School, the Benevolent Society, and the Sunday Scholars' Clothing Society were started.

In a much more up-to-date piece of history, Betty has found a copy of *The Norfolk Unitarian* from August 2010, when Neville and Kate (who hadn't even started her ministry training at that point) were both down to lead worship.

What's a bit weird is that Kate can't find any record that she actually did preach on those weeks, or that she's ever preached on that topic!

Little did either of us know . . .!



# Do you find this easier to read?

Almost everything we provide in print at church (including services, Calendars, letters, reports, and the minutes of most meetings) is available in a large-print format, and a recorded version of the Calendar is available on CD and on memory disk.

## Accessibility

We want our church and our community to be as accessible to everyone as it possibly can be. As well as providing everything in large print, we have a hearing loop, wheelchair access at the back of the building, and an accessible toilet.

Our services and other events are fidget-friendly!

We have also recently taken possession of a new lightweight, easily collapsible, sturdy wheelchair. The wheelchair lives in the cupboard under the front stairs, and you are free to use it at any time it would be useful in church.

If you have a short-term need at home and would like to borrow it, please speak to one of the church officers.

We know that there will be needs we haven't accounted for: if there is anything which would make it easier for you to engage with what we do, please please do tell us!
