## **THE BELL!**

Rev. Dr. Len Smith, formerly minister at Stand and Principal of Unitarian College, Manchester, is writing a book about church bells; when Roger and I visited Kendal Unitarian Chapel, recently, Len asked us if we could supply a photograph of the bell which now stands in our foyer but originally hung in the tower above the Bank Street entrance of Bank Street Unitarian Chapel. This was a single tolling bell, and I think I remember a rope looped back at each side of this entrance.

From the photograph, Len was able to tell us that the bell was manufactured in 1777---possibly not the first bell in the first Unitarian church in Bury, but certainly the one transferred to every subsequent chapel on our site. The bell bears the legend "Come away, make no delay", and this is followed by the initials T and R, separated by a small bell which tells us that our bell was made by the Rudhall family from Gloucester---in fact, by Thomas Rudhall, the son of Abraham.

Len now has sufficient information about our bell to include it in his book; fame at last! However, he has issued a note of caution: we should be careful about spreading information about the bell, as it has been known for such bells to be stolen, despite their size and weight! *Anne*

## **NOTES FROM CHURCH COUNCIL: 14-10-13**

Anne reported that her contact at "The Bury Times" had left; she now has a new contact and hopes that he will be equally good. A small committee has been formed to make preliminary arrangements for the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebrations and will report back shortly.

**Finance:** Organists' fees will continue to be paid from church-funds, so that the congregation are aware of the costs; better lights have been fitted near the heating-controls and the gas-meter; Council approved annual donations to various organisations; Council also approved a freeze on lettings-charges for 2014; concerns were expressed about the duties of the cleaners, and this will be pursued; the G.A. Collection will be made up to £50.

**The Treasurer** reported that we are currently slightly ahead of our forecast-budget but predicted that we might fall behind by the year-end; he had analysed the cost to the church of the year's Sunday services and suggested that, in the light of rising costs and declining membership, we might all consider giving a little extra, each week.

**Efforts:** The Philharmonic Brass Concert had been excellent; arrangements are now in hand for the Christmas Concert on 30-11-13.

**Communications and Worship with Young People:** The new plaque for Holebottom has now been made and should be in place soon; there was discussion about the transfer of the Junior Church from the Primary to the Lounge; this is quite a complex issue, so there will be a trial-period; both Anne and Beryl have supplied short articles to appear in the November issue of "The Associate"; repairs to the main door will be carried out on 15-10-13.

**The Minister** reported that the discussion on Bullying had been excellent and very worthwhile; she expressed concern about the low attendance at services during the summer months; seminars on congregational growth are to be organised after Christmas; a trip to Chester will be organised, in November; the service on 17-11-13 will be conducted by members of the congregation.

**Charity Committee:** The total amount presented to North West Air Ambulance was £1,271.46; at the next meeting, suggestions for next year's charity will be considered; the congregation will then be invited to vote on the choices; already suggested are the new Bury Hospice and Bury Deaf Society.

**NELUM:** The August meeting, at Ansdell, was very pleasant; Nelum continues to supply large grants to churches in the district, in order to support Ministry, and also to enable churches to repair their premises;

Future Ministry in Lancashire will be considered on 19-10-13, at a meeting at Bank Street, Bolton.

**Lettings:** Council approved two requests: one for a piano concert, on 17-12-13, and the other for a Day Gathering of the Unitarian Renewal Group, on 27-09-14.

**Membership Secretary:** We need to take action to increase our membership, although it is difficult to attract younger people; we have the largest Sunday School in the whole of Nelum; many of its churches have no children attending; children who attend events at Hucklow do not necessarily attend Unitarian Churches.

**Correspondence** was received from The Penal Affairs Panel, enclosing a letter to be sent to Ivan Lewis, M.P; with regard to the Government's refusal to mount a Royal Commission on the use and abuse of drugs; it was agreed that this should be sent, as we had voted for it at the G.A. AGM's; we are requested to participate in a congregational census, on each Sunday in November; the G.A. will then analyse the results, in order to ascertain the numerical strength of the movement and to determine decision-making in the future. Other items of correspondence have been placed on the notice-board for information.

**Any Other Business:** There was discussion about the use of our two parking-spaces; these seem to be respected, and we are not experiencing problems.

**The next meeting** will be held on December 9<sup>th</sup>, at 7 p.m.
